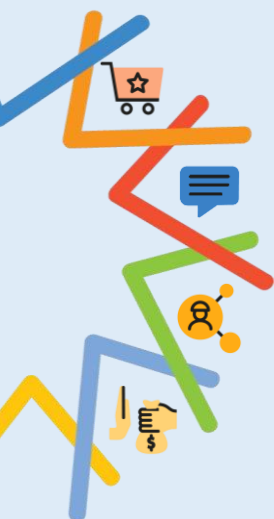

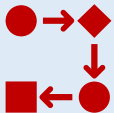

The Activity Report of the Portuguese National Contact Point for Responsible Business Conduct (NCP PT) is an annual online publication prepared by the NCP PT team of the Directorate-General for Economic Activities (DGAE). This report, made available in Portuguese and English, aims to identify the activities carried out in the context of the NCP PT in 2025.

The 2025 edition presents, in a chronological and structured manner, the set of initiatives developed throughout the year, including participation in 11 OECD-level meetings, 11 initiatives implemented within collaborations and partnerships with national and international entities, 9 publications (videos, written materials and newsletters), 5 relevant developments in the structure and functioning of the NCP PT and the organisation of 4 dedicated events (3 international workshops and 1 annual webinar), reflecting a year of intense activity and strengthened institutional engagement.



Video Tutorial: OECD Guidelines – Chapter III

February 3

The video tutorial dedicated to Chapter III of the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises explores the topic of Disclosure, one of the essential pillars of Responsible Business Conduct. This audiovisual resource seeks to clarify the importance of robust transparency practices, underlining that enterprises should provide regular, timely, reliable and clearly presented information, ensuring that it is complete, accurate and comparable.



Meeting of the OECD Inclusive Platform on Due Diligence Policy Cooperation



March 17

NCP PT took part in the inaugural meeting of this platform, a global forum created to strengthen coordination and coherence of public due diligence policies in the area of RBC. The meeting brought together more than 60 delegations from various regions of the world, in a format geared towards knowledge sharing and technical discussion on the implementation of voluntary and mandatory due diligence measures. The three thematic sessions focused on support for enterprises in trade partner countries, models of regulatory cooperation (including interoperability), and the role of sustainability initiatives as mechanisms to support compliance. NCP PT is a member of this global Platform, contributing to reduce policy divergences and promote alignment with OECD standards.



Meeting of the Working Party on Responsible Business Conduct



March 18 & 19

The NCP PT participated in the meeting of the OECD Working Party on Responsible Business Conduct, which addressed the final approval of the Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible AI, the 2025–2026 work plan on due diligence, and the annual activity report of the NCPs, in which the NCP PT was recognised as the NCP with the highest number of outreach publications. The meeting also included the presentation of several peer reviews and their follow-up, as well as a discussion on strengthening the governance of the network, enabling the NCP PT to consolidate its monitoring of international trends and its institutional profile within the OECD.

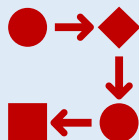


Workshop on NCP Promotional Activities for the MENA+T Regional NCP Network



March 19

Participation in the international workshop dedicated to developing NCP promotional plans, where the NCP PT presented its experience in designing awareness-raising strategies without a dedicated budget and was highlighted as a success story. The intervention covered practices such as preparing an annual promotional plan, creating digital resources, strengthening national and international visibility, and adopting low-cost methods to reach diverse audiences. This participation helped support peer-learning processes and contributed to strengthening the capacities of NCPs in the MENA+T region.

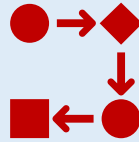


OECD Watch webinar: Framework and criteria for NCP evaluations



March 25

The NCP PT participated in the international webinar dedicated to presenting the latest findings on NCP performance, an initiative that included contributions from the OECD Secretariat and space for discussion with participants. The session made it possible to deepen the comparative analysis of the evaluations carried out, to understand structural trends within the network and to clarify how this exercise is linked to ongoing work in the field of Responsible Business Conduct (RBC). The participation of the NCP PT reinforced the national commitment to the critical and continuous monitoring of international practice and to the development of a system of continuous improvement.



Training course: General Regime for the Prevention of Corruption

March 26

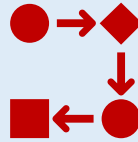
The NCP PT team took part in the internal training course on the General Regime for the Prevention of Corruption, organised by the Directorate-General for Economic Activities, which focused on policies and procedures for preventing corruption and related offences, including the code of conduct, reporting mechanisms and the management of conflicts of interest. This participation helps to strengthen a culture of integrity, transparency and accountability within the public administration, in line with the principles underpinning Responsible Business Conduct (RBC) and the mandate of the NCP PT.



Video Tutorial: OECD Guidelines – Chapter IV

May 2

The video tutorial dedicated to Chapter IV of the OECD Guidelines focuses on Human Rights, clarifying the role of enterprises in preventing and managing adverse impacts throughout their activities and business relationships. This resource seeks to explain, in an accessible way, the international expectations regarding human rights due diligence, including the identification, prevention, mitigation and remediation of impacts, reinforcing the importance of integrating these principles into corporate governance and day-to-day business practices.



Procedures Guide: Stakeholder Consultation

May 26

Given that any individual or organisation with a legitimate interest may submit a case to an NCP regarding alleged non-observance of the Guidelines, it is essential to have clear rules guiding this process. In this context, a new bilingual (Portuguese/English) version of the NCP PT Case-Handling Procedures has been prepared to replace the version currently in force, which predates the 2023 update of the Guidelines. The stakeholders consulted included representatives from academia, public administration, business, workers' organisations and civil society. This process was launched at the end of May 2025.



NCP PT Newsletter Issue no. 4

June 2

In June, the NCP PT published the fourth edition of its semi-annual newsletter, a key instrument for disseminating national and international developments in the field of Responsible Business Conduct (RBC), as well as for strengthening the visibility of NCP PT activities. This edition brings together expert analyses, annual overviews and promotional initiatives, reflecting a continued commitment to transparency and the dissemination of relevant information to all stakeholders.



Meeting of the Working Party on Responsible Business Conduct



June 16, 17 & 24

In June, the NCP PT participated in a closed meeting of the OECD Working Party on Responsible Business Conduct dedicated to the selection process for the next WPRBC Chair, which included formal interviews with the candidates, a discussion facilitated by the Secretariat and a first round of straw polling to support consensus-building. This participation made it possible to closely follow this key governance process for the future functioning of the network.



Meeting of the National Contact Point Network for RBC



June 18 & 19

The NCP PT took part in the virtual meeting of the NCP Network, dedicated to core operational issues such as strengthening business engagement with NCPs, developing model terms of reference for mediation, managing parallel proceedings and ensuring a more balanced distribution of specific instances across the network, as well as analysing regulatory developments in RBC and their implications for the NCP mandate. The session also marked the launch of the implementation of the new 2025–2028 Action Plan to Strengthen NCPs, including discussion of a mentoring programme, future priorities and funding strategies.

Workshop

The Role of NCPs in Upholding Human Rights

July 10

In July, the NCP PT organised an international online workshop dedicated to the role of NCPs in promoting Human Rights under Chapter IV of the OECD Guidelines, bringing together a panel moderated by Professor Claire Bright and featuring contributions from Marian Ingrams (OECD Watch), Jacqueline Kacprzak (Polish NCP), Elsa Dias (Office of the Ombudsperson) and Sara Ágoas (Portuguese National Human Rights Committee). The session included the presentation of the video tutorial on Chapter IV and concluded with a Q&A segment, fostering dialogue between experts and participants on the challenges of RBC in the field of human rights.



Video Tutorial: OECD Guidelines – Chapter V

August 4

The NCP PT published the video tutorial dedicated to Chapter V of the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises, focused on Employment and Industrial Relations. The video explains, in a concise and accessible way, the expectations placed on enterprises to promote decent working conditions, respect the fundamental rights of workers and prevent abusive or discriminatory labour practices, thereby reinforcing the importance of responsible business conduct in the labour sphere.



Meeting with Association GRACE – Empresas Responsáveis

The NCP PT met with the association GRACE – Empresas Responsáveis, with the aim of presenting its mandate, the functioning of the specific instance mechanism and the main lines of work in promoting Responsible Business Conduct (RBC) under the OECD Guidelines. The meeting made it possible to exchange information on GRACE's mission, areas of activity and member network, as a business platform dedicated to social responsibility and sustainability, and to identify possible entry points for future outreach on the Guidelines and the specific instance mechanism to the business sector.

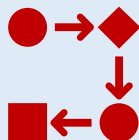


Informal Meeting of Experts on Business and Human Rights



September 4

The NCP PT participated in the 5th Informal EU Expert Meeting on Business and Human Rights, organised by the European External Action Service, which was dedicated to an open discussion on how to advance the European Business and Human Rights agenda in light of recent EU and international developments. The discussion focused on the implementation of the United Nations Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights, reflections on the elements of a future European framework on Business and Human Rights, the ongoing negotiations of a legally binding United Nations instrument in this area, and the articulation with relevant international initiatives and fora.



ILO Training: Decent Work and RBC

September 16, 17, 18 & 19

The NCP PT participated in the training course “Responsible Business Conduct, International Labour Standards and Decent Work: Current Trends and Opportunities”, organised by the ILO International Training Centre in Turin from 16 to 19 September. Addressed to NCPs, the initiative aimed to strengthen understanding of the international labour standards system and its relationship with RBC, deepening the labour dimension of the OECD Guidelines and the ILO Tripartite Declaration. The programme helped to build capacities for a more effective application of these reference frameworks, including in stakeholder engagement and the handling of specific instances, and provided a joint working space on labour market trends and opportunities for cooperation in RBC.



Interview on “Human Rights and Global Governance”

September 19

NCP PT participated, in 2025, in an interview conducted as part of a Master’s thesis in Corporate Sustainability Management at Friedrich-Alexander-Universität Erlangen-Nürnberg. The research examines the role of the OECD Guidelines and National Contact Points in protecting human rights in business, with a particular focus on integrating local, bottom-up perspectives into global governance instruments that are traditionally top-down. The study explores practical challenges related to stakeholder engagement and the inclusion of local actors, with the aim of identifying ways to strengthen the effectiveness and inclusiveness of human rights due diligence mechanisms.



Session “Human Rights vs. Competitiveness: A False Dilemma?”



September 24

The NCP PT took part in a session organised by the European External Action Service and the United Nations Development Programme, where the above-mentioned study was presented for the first time to EU Member States. This is the first study in which Responsible Business Conduct (RBC), in its human rights dimension, is treated as a data-driven business case, drawing on five years of information on 235 large global companies to demonstrate that improved human rights performance does not undermine competitiveness and is, on the contrary, associated with gains in financial indicators, particularly in terms of asset efficiency.

September 25

The NCP PT organised an international online workshop dedicated to Chapter V of the OECD Guidelines, focusing on the role of NCPs in promoting Responsible Business Conduct (RBC) in the field of employment and industrial relations. The session included the presentation of the video tutorial developed by the NCP PT on this chapter and a panel discussion, moderated by Kari Irwin Otteburn, which brought together representatives of international organisations, trade unions and National Contact Points, providing an opportunity to discuss practical challenges and ways to strengthen labour due diligence.

The NCP PT published the video tutorial dedicated to Chapter VI of the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises, focused on Environment. The video explains, in a clear and accessible way, the expectations placed on enterprises regarding environmental protection and their contribution to sustainable development, underlining the importance of environmental due diligence and the integration of environmental impacts into the day-to-day management of business activities.



Bilateral Meeting between NCP PT and OECD: Exchange on garment and footwear sector work



October 16

The NCP PT hosted, at the premises of the Directorate-General for Economic Activities (DGAE), a delegation from the OECD Centre for RBC for a bilateral meeting dedicated to the garment and footwear sector implementation programme, led by Andrea Schill. The meeting made it possible to deepen understanding of the Sectoral Forum, manufacturers' networks, due diligence support tools and the assessment of sustainability initiatives, as well as to explore opportunities for future cooperation and for supporting Portuguese companies in adopting the OECD guidance on responsible value chains in this sector.

Workshop

The Role of NCPs in Environmental Responsibility

October 23

The NCP PT organised an international online workshop dedicated to Chapter VI of the OECD Guidelines, focusing on the role of NCPs in promoting environmental responsibility, risk-based due diligence and a just green transition. The session, moderated by Laura Íñigo Álvarez, featured contributions from Lúdia Farropas, Sophie Rickard and Susana Fonseca, providing a forum to discuss the challenges and opportunities involved in aligning business practices with environmental protection and sustainable development objectives.



Webinar “Shared success: collaboration between governments and stakeholders on responsible business conduct”



October 25

The NCP PT participated in this webinar, organised by the OECD, which focused on the central role of stakeholder engagement in promoting RBC and ensuring the effective implementation of due diligence. The session presented the OECD Recommendation on the role of governments in promoting RBC, as well as practical examples of collaboration between governments, businesses, trade unions, civil society organisations and NCPs. The webinar provided an opportunity to discuss more inclusive and effective approaches to stakeholder participation and to strengthen the alignment of public policies with international expectations on RBC.



Meeting of the OECD Inclusive Platform on Due Diligence Policy Cooperation



October 27 & 28

The second meeting of this platform brought together 68 national delegations from various regions of the world, as well as representatives of the ILO, OHCHR and business, trade union and civil society organisations. The discussion focused on the need for simplification and coherence between different international instruments and legislative requirements on sustainability, in response to the proliferation of standards and reporting obligations. Participants examined ways to align criteria between the ESRS, the IFRS standards of the ISSB Foundation and the GRI indicators, as well as their articulation with the CS3D. The OECD underlined that reporting should be useful, comparable and focused on the most significant risks, avoiding disproportionate burdens, and emphasised the importance of aligning investment, trade, public procurement and sustainable finance policies with the OECD Guidelines and the UN Guiding Principles.



Roundtable on Corporate Sustainability Practices



October 29

This session, held at the OECD Conference Centre in Paris, brought together representatives from the Corporate Governance Committee, the Working Party on State Ownership and Privatisation Practices and the Working Party on Responsible Business Conduct. The event marked the release of the OECD Global Corporate Sustainability Report 2025. The programme featured two panels: one dedicated to sustainability disclosure practices, including the adoption of IFRS S1/S2 standards and the European Sustainability Reporting Standards (ESRS), and another focused on the specific challenges of the energy sector, with the participation of financial regulators and major international energy companies. The NCP PT's participation made it possible to closely follow the convergence of global reporting standards and the strengthening of the interface between corporate governance and Responsible Business Conduct (RBC).



Meeting of the Working Party on Responsible Business Conduct



October 29 & 30

In October, the NCP PT participated in the meeting of the Working Party on Responsible Business Conduct, whose agenda covered key issues such as preparations for the 50th anniversary of the OECD Guidelines, an update on ongoing work on due diligence, the presentation of the draft Compendium of Good Practice and the discussion of NCP reporting back in the context of peer reviews, as set out in the official agenda. This participation made it possible to follow the evolution of international guidance and to strengthen the national contribution to the network's governance processes.



Meeting of the National Contact Point Network for RBC



October 30 & 31

NCP Portugal participated in the NCP Network meeting in Paris, which included a stakeholder dialogue session, the final review of the mediation terms of reference templates, and an update to the guidance on coordination among NCPs in specific instances, as well as a thematic session dedicated to “responsible disengagement”. The programme also included onboarding moments for new representatives, a confidential discussion of ongoing cases, and working space for regional networks, reinforcing the exchange of experience and the consolidation of common practices across the network.



Collaboration with the ILO: Testing the Helpdesk's AI Virtual Assistant

October 31

The ILO piloted a new AI virtual assistant (chatbot) for its Helpdesk for Business on International Labour Standards and invited a selected group of users, including the NCP PT, to test the tool. As part of this collaboration, the NCP PT was asked to assess the usefulness and clarity of the replies, the tone and accessibility of the language, the ease of use of the assistant, and the accuracy of citations and references provided. This feedback helped the ILO refine the tool and determine whether users prefer more informal, conversational answers or responses that follow a more formal and official style.



Meeting with workshop moderators: “Shaping the Future – Key Messages from NCP PT’s 2025 Workshops”



November 10

The NCP PT met with Claire Bright, Kari Irwin Otteburn and Laura Íñigo Álvarez for a joint exercise to synthesise the key messages from the three international workshops held in 2025, dedicated to Chapters IV, V and VI of the OECD Guidelines. The meeting made it possible to consolidate reflections on human rights, decent work and the environment, identify cross-cutting priorities to strengthen the NCP system and outline next steps for national action and for the network as a whole. The discussion fed into an article published in the December edition of the NCP PT Newsletter, which brings together the main conclusions and strategic guidance put forward by the moderators.



Coordination meeting of the Southern European NCP Network



November 11

The NCP PT took part in the coordination meeting of the Southern European NCP Network, which was dedicated to identifying areas for collaboration in 2026 in the context of the celebrations of the 50th anniversary of the OECD Guidelines, including joint digital outreach actions, the sharing of good practices and the organisation of international events. During the meeting, the NCP PT expressed its willingness to contribute with a concise synthesis of national good practices for the network's joint compilation, to host a feature article on the Southern European NCP Network's initiatives in the next edition of its Newsletter, and to organise, in 2026, an international workshop on the OECD Guidelines chapter on Consumer Interests, to be framed as part of the 50th-anniversary celebrations of the Guidelines.



Interview conducted by the Observatory on the SDGs in Portuguese Companies

November 12

The NCP PT took part in an interview conducted by the Observatory on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in Portuguese Companies, a research project of Católica Lisbon School of Business & Economics, as part of its annual cycle of analysis of corporate sustainability in Portugal. The discussion aimed to gather the NCP PT's perspective on trends, challenges and opportunities in the implementation of the SDGs by companies and to understand recent developments in sustainability practices in the national context, addressing, among other aspects, the update of the Procedural Guide, the cycle of workshops dedicated to the OECD Guidelines, involvement in training initiatives and international developments in the field of RBC, including the growing need for coherence between normative instruments and reporting mechanisms.



Practical Class at NOVA BHRE



November 13

The NCP PT, in collaboration with NOVA BHRE, led a practical session simulating the mediation of specific instances involving alleged non-observance of the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises in the field of Responsible Business Conduct (RBC). The class enabled students to experience, in a simulated setting, the role of NCPs in mediating between enterprises and stakeholders, strengthening skills in dialogue facilitation, problem-solving and the construction of consensual solutions in complex business and human rights scenarios.



Session: “Strengthening Synergies Between NCPs and National Human Rights Institutions”



November 24

The NCP PT participated in the international session organised by GANHRI, the OECD and OHCHR, which highlighted the complementarity between the mandates of NCPs and National Human Rights Institutions in promoting human rights, decent work and environmental protection, underlining the importance of accessible non-judicial mechanisms and structured cooperation to address challenges such as access barriers, power imbalances and the need for more effective responses in specific instances. The session also presented international examples of cooperation and outlined possible future directions for joint action.



Meeting with the Portuguese Platform for Non-Governmental Development Organisations



November 26

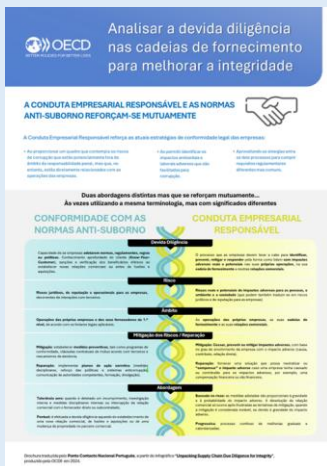
The NCP PT held its first meeting with the Portuguese NGDO Platform (PPONGD), in a preparatory exchange for the annual webinar, aimed at presenting the NCP PT's recent activities and exploring avenues for cooperation in 2026. The session helped to establish an institutional bridge with the Portuguese NGDO network, clarifying the role of the OECD Guidelines and the relevance of the specific instance mechanism for civil society, and marked a first step towards strengthening structured dialogue between the NCP PT and the PPONGD, with a view to raising awareness of RBC and promoting greater participation of NGDOs in future initiatives.



Webinar 2025: Shaping the Future of Responsible Business Conduct

December 4

The NCP PT held its annual webinar, “Shaping the Future of Responsible Business Conduct: the way forward for Enterprises, Consumers and Civil Society”, in an online format. The session included the screening of the teaser video “Shaping the Future: Key Messages from NCP PT’s 2025 Workshops” and a panel discussion bringing together representatives from GRACE, DECO and the Portuguese NGDO Platform, focused on how RBC influences business decisions, consumer choices and scrutiny by civil society. The webinar provided a structured space for dialogue between enterprises, consumers and civil society organisations, helping to identify emerging risks and commitments for 2026.

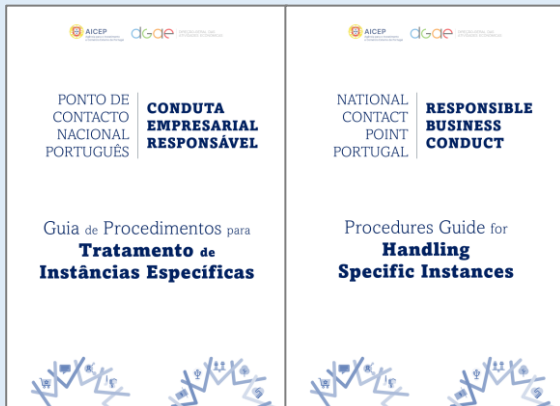
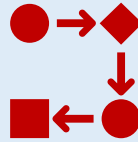
The NCP PT launched a brochure based on the translation and adaptation of the infographic “Unpacking Supply Chain Due Diligence for Integrity”, produced by the OECD in 2024. This brochure provides a visual and accessible overview of the relationship between Responsible Business Conduct (RBC) and anti-bribery standards, clarifying how both approaches mutually reinforce each other, and presents an evolving landscape of international and European legislative instruments related to due diligence, as well as a set of practical steps for integrating corruption risk management into the supply chain.

The NCP PT released the video “Shaping the Future: Key Messages from NCP PT’s 2025 Workshops”, which compiles the contributions of Claire Bright, Kari Irwin Otteburn and Laura Íñigo Álvarez drawn from the three international workshops dedicated to Chapters IV, V and VI of the OECD Guidelines. The video summarises the main messages on human rights, decent work and the environment, highlighting future priorities for the NCP PT and for the wider NCP network, and was premiered on the NCP PT’s YouTube channel, with a teaser screened during the annual webinar on the future of Responsible Business Conduct (RBC).



Guia de Procedimentos: Published

The NCP PT completed the revision and publication of its new Procedural Guide for the Handling of Specific Instances, aligned with the 2023 edition of the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises, and made it available in a bilingual Portuguese/English version on the DGAE website. This guide clarifies the different stages of the procedure, indicative timelines, admissibility criteria and the rules on transparency, confidentiality, conflict-of-interest management and follow-up, thereby strengthening the predictability, accessibility and accountability of the NCP PT grievance mechanism.

The NCP PT published the 5th edition of its newsletter, dedicated to reflecting on the future of RBC in light of the main activities carried out over the year. 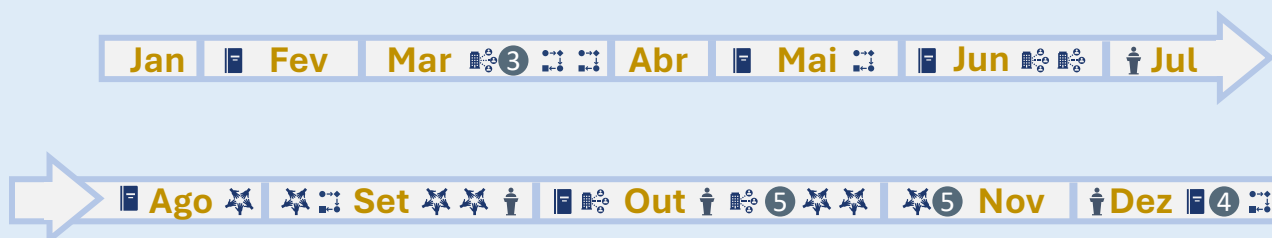


Activity Report 2025

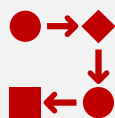
